COUNTER-PETITION FOR ACCOUNTING, TRUST INFORMATION, AND **OTHER RELIEF** 

Edward G. Fiedler and Martha A. Fiedler, Irrevocable Trust Agreement dated June 1, 1993

Petitioner, Stearns County Human Services, for its petition pursuant to Minn. Stat. §§ 501C.0201 et seq., for accounting, trust information, and other relief, states and alleges as follows:

1. The subject matter of this Petition is the Edward G. Fiedler and Martha A Fiedler Irrevocable Trust Agreement dated June 1, 1993 (the "Trust"). A copy of the Trust is on file with the Court and made a part of this Petition.

2. Martha A. Fiedler (deceased December 19, 2020) and her husband, Edward G. Fiedler (deceased August 4, 1993), created the Trust together on June 1, 1993, appointing Jean M. Fiedler and Alicen M. Barrett as co-

3. Martha A. Fiedler was a recipient of Medical Assistance ("MA") starting in 2013 through the date of her death.

4. The estate of Martha A. Fiedler is indebted in the amount of \$250,436.55 for MA expenditures as of December 19, 2020, as evidenced by a claims history report on file with Stearns County Human Services and current as of December 19, 2023.

5. Minnesota Statute § 256B.15, the estate recovery statute, states it is the policy of this state that those participating in the medical assistance program, "use their own assets to pay their share of the cost of their care during or after their enrollment in the program according to applicable federal law and the laws of this state." Minn. Stat. § 256B.15, subd 1(a).

Minnesota Statute § 256B.15, subd. 1a, which describes estates subject to claims, includes "the person's probate estate" and "assets inveved to a survivor assign of the person through survivorship, living trust, transfer-on-death of title or deed, or other arrangements." Minn. Stat. § 256B.15, subd. 1a(b) (1) and (5).

7. A living trust is defined as a trust which is operative during the life of the settlor. Black's Law Dictionary, Fifth Edition. The Edward G. Fiedler and Martha A Fiedler Irrevocable Trust Agreement dated June 1, 1993 (the "Trust") is a living trust.

8. Martha A. Fiedler, Trustor, had a beneficial interest in the trust estate during the period of time she received MA and at the time of her death.

9. Article 2a of the Trust directs the trustees to pay the entire net income from the Trust Estate in monthly or other convenient installments to the Trustors or either of them.

10. Article 2b of the Trust provides Trustors an additional beneficial interest of up to \$10,000.00 per year (up to \$2,000 monthly) at the discretion of the trustees.

11. Article 2d of the Trust provides Trustors the right to live in the real property placed in the Trust rent free for so long as they or either of them wished.

12. Article 5b of the Trust provided the Trustor the power to reacquire any item of Trust corpus by substituting other property of equivalent value.

13. Article 12 reserved to the Trustors the right to remove any individual trustee without cause on thirty days' written notice.

14. This Petition is filed as a claim by an interested person in relation to a trust pursuant to Minnesota Statute §

501C.0201(a) and (b). 15. Petitioner herein in-

vokes the jurisdiction of the district court as an in rem proceeding pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 501C.0201(c).

16. The Court has subject matter jurisdiction over the trust pursuant to Minnesota Statute §501C.0202, including but not limited to Minnesota Statute § 501C.0202 (1), (2), (3), (4), (5), (8), and (24).

17. An accounting of the trust pursuant to § 501C.0202,

subd. 8, is necessary in order for the court to confirm actions taken by the trustee, approve the account, and approve paythe trust.

18. The Trustees have agreed to the jurisdiction of this Court.

19. Martha A. Fiedler, Trustor, was a beneficiary of the Trust as she had an interest in the income of the Trust time of her death.

20. Upon Martha A. man Services.

21. Petitioner herein requests the Court to require an against the Trust estate, and instruct the Trustees to distribute assets of the Trust in payment of the claim in accordance with the law.

- 1.1 Authority. This Ordinance is adopted pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section
- 1.2 Purpose. Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 462C. 16, there is hereby created and established for the County of Steams a fund to be known and denominated as the Steams County Housing Trust Fund (the "Housing Trust Fund"). The Housing Trust Fund shall be a permanent source of funding and a continually renewable source of revenue to meet, in part, the housing needs of Moderate, Low Income and Very Low Income households, as defined by HUD, of the County. The Housing Trust Fund shall provide loans and grants to property owners, homeowners, local units of government, for-profit housing developers, and nonprofit housing developers for the following purposes: (1) acquisition, capital and soft costs necessary for the creation of new Affordable and Workforce Housing (both rental and owner- occupied), (2) acquisition, rehabilitation, capital and soft costs necessary for the preservation of existing Affordable and Workforce Housing (both rental and owner-occupied); (3) acquisition, capital and soft costs necessary for the creation of new Mixed Income Housing (both rental and owner- occupied); (4) the rehabilitation of the existing housing stock; (5) assist with funding of programs that prevent and end homelessness; and (6) other housing expenditures that are consistent with Minnesota Statutes, Section 462C.16 Subd. (3). Projects funded by the Housing Trust Fund shall be dispersed throughout Steams County.

SECTION 2: DEFINI-**TIONS** 

2.1 "Affordable" means a housing unit that has an Affordable Housing Cost

2.2 "Affordable Housing Cost" means an amount satisfied by:

2.2.1 For owner-occupied housing, a housing payment inclusive of loan principal, loan interest, property taxes, property and mortgage insurance, and homeowner association dues which allows a moderate, low, or very low income household to purchase a home while paying no more than thirty percent (30%) of their gross household income.

2.2.2 For rental or cooperative housing, a housing payment, inclusive of a reasonable allowance for heating, allows a moderate, low, or very low income household to rent a unit while paying no more than thirty percent (30%) of their gross household income.

2.3 "Area Median Income" means the income guidelines established and published annually by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.

2.4 "Assisted Unit" means a housing unit that is Affordable because of assistance from the Housing Trust Fund.

2.5 "Grants Supervisor" means the Stearns County Housing and Redevelopment Authority of Stearns County, Minnesota Executive Director, or his or her designee.

2.6 "Housing Trust Fund" means the Stearns County Housing Trust Fund.

2.7 "Housing Trust Fund Board" means a board made up of two (2) members from the HRA board, two (2) members from the Stearns County Board of Commissioners, and three (3) members appointed by the Stearns County Board of Commissioners.

2.8 "HRA" means the Housing and Redevelopment Authority in and for the County of Stearns the Housing and Rede-

velopment Authority of Stearns Projects applying for funds. County, Minnesota.

2.9 "Jurisdiction" - Includes all of Stearns County, Min-

2.10 "Low Income" means gross household income that is at or below eighty percent (80%) of Area Median Income, but more than fifty percent (50%) of Area Median Income.

2.11 "Mixed Income Housing" means a residential structure that comprises differing levels of affordability, with some units at market rate and others available to low and moderate income households at below-market rates.

2.12 "Moderate Income" means gross household income that is at or below 115 percent (115%) of Area Median Income, but more than eighty percent (80%) of Area Median Income.

2.13 "Permanent Source of Funding" means once funds are allocated to the Housing Trust those funds can only be expended for purposes outlined in SECTION 4 of this document.

2.14 "Project" may mean a single-family house (attached or detached) or a multifamily property, either as owner-occupied property or rental proper-

2.15 "Recipient" means any homeowner, for-profit, nonprofit or local unit of government housing developer that receives funds in the form of a loan or a grant from the Housing Trust Fund Account. A Recipient may be an individual, partnership, local unit of government, joint venture limited liability company or partnership, association or corpora-

2.16 "Very Low Income" means gross household income that is at or below fifty percent (50%) of Area Median Income.

2.17 "Workforce Housing" means owner-occupied or rental housing units that are provided to households with at least one member per unit who is gainfully employed at the time of entry into the unit.

**SECTION 3: HOUSING** TRUST FUND ACCOUNT; TRUST SOURCE  $\mathbf{OF}$ 

3.1 There is also hereby established a Stearns County Housing Trust Fund Account, to be maintained by the HRA on behalf of the Trust Fund shall be deposited in the Trust Fund Account. Principal and interest from loan repayments, and all other income from Trust Fund activities, shall be deposited in the Trust Fund Account. All interest earnings from the Trust Fund Account shall be reinvested and dedicated to the Trust Fund Ac-

3.3 The Trust Fund may consist of funds derived from any other source, including but not limited to the following:

3.3.1 Tax Increment returned to the County after decertification of a TIF district.

3.3.2 Any other appropriations as determined from time to time by action of the HRA or County Board.

#### SECTION 4: TRUST **'UND DISTRIBUTIONS**

4.1 The Housing Trust Fund is to function as a resource to fund loans and grants in strict accordance with this Section. The HRA shall review and adopt a policy to establish the process and other administrative parameters of the loans and grants permitted by the Housing Trust Fund. The Housing Trust Fund shall be administered by the Grants Supervisor of the HRA. No disbursements may be made from the Housing Trust Fund Account without the prior approval of the Housing Trust Fund Board.

4.2 Disbursements from the Housing Trust Fund Account shall be made as loans or grants to assist Recipients in the creation of Assisted Units and administrative fees not to exceed ten percent (10%). Recipients may use the funds to pay for: capital costs, including but not limited to the actual costs of rehabilitating or constructing Assisted Units; preserving Affordable units; demolishing or converting existing non-residential buildings to create new Assisted Units; real property acquisition costs; down payment assistance; rental assistance; home buyer counseling services; and professional service costs, including but not limited to, those costs incurred for architectural, engineering, planning and legal services which are attributable to the creation of Assisted Units.

4.3 All projects must be reviewed by the Housing Trust Fund Board prior to any ac-

4.4 The HRA shall within thirty (30) days following the close of each fiscal year prepare and submit an annual report to the County on the activities undertaken with funds from the Housing Trust Fund. # **Rockville Comprehensive Plan and Zoning Ordinance Update**

The City of Rockville last updated its comprehensive plan twenty years ago. Moving into 2024, the City is looking to the future and will spend the next several months updating and identifying a long-term vision of community goals and implementation strategies that will position the city to make sound financial decisions regarding future expansion and community development. The updated Comprehensive Plan (Comp Plan) and Zoning Ordinance will provide clear, workable recommendations and serve as the framework for development policies while inspiring, guiding, and directing the growth of Rockville.

Throughout the process, Rockville, in partnership with consultant Bolton & Menk, Inc. will review existing conditions and longterm goals, and engage with the community to better understand issues and opportunities in creating a

What is a Comp Plan? A Comp Plan sets achievable goals and implementable policies that guide growth, land use decisions, and future investments for the area. Comp plans also set policies that guide decisions on public and private infrastructure and facilities and help account for changes that occur over decades.

What is the goal of a Comp Plan?

The goal of the updated Comp Plan is to establish an implementable roadmap that drives growth and opportunity in Rockville.

How is a Comp Plan

The project team will analyze population trends, transportation patterns, natural resources, economic development activity, recreation activity, housing, municipal services to identify community priorities and areas of opportunity for growth. They will also consider existing conditions like existing plans and current development efforts. The project team will also collect public feedback through a survey and at public events and research top issues to identify solutions and goals that will meet community priorities.

What are zoning codes?

Zoning codes are part of a city's municipal code and must comply with the jurisdiction's adopted comprehensive plans (vision for future growth). They are used to define areas for allowable types of development and land uses. Zoning codes also create standards for development such as size, location, and design. They are often represented by a combination of standards like setbacks/lot size/height limits, as well as performance standards like noise/light controls and are accompanied by a zoning

How can I provide in-

The City is beginning outreach efforts that will continue through April with opportunities for residents and business owners to get involved through a survey, in-person conversations, stakeholder meetings and digital engagement through the project website and email updates. Visit the project website at https://arcg.is/qy9TO1 to learn more about this project and to sign up to receive project updates.

The comments and survey results collected during the outreach period will be analyzed to determine common themes that allow the team to quantify the issues and opportunities for the Comp Plan. After finding common threads from community engagement and analyzing research, the project team will recommend specific, action-focused goals to guide the updated Comp Plan.

# An Eye-Opening Way to Start Your

## **MDA Reminds Farmers** of Proper Bulk Fertilizer **Storage**

Storage areas for dry and liquid fertilizer must be permitted

Ahead of the planting season, the Minnesota Department of Agriculture (MDA) is reminding farmers of proper storage guidelines for bulk fertilizer.

Bulk liquid fertilizer can contaminate soil, surface water, and groundwater if a storage tank or pipe leaks. Dry fertilizer can also leach into the environment if it is placed on the ground and mixes with snow and rain.

To limit the risk of environmental impacts, liquid fertilizer tanks must be inside a containment system that will hold any spills. This is called secondary containment. Dry fertilizer must be stored on an impervious surface and in a roofed area that will protect its contents from the elements. There may be other requirements depending on the location of the stored dry fertilizer.

Farmers storing any amount of dry bulk fertilizer on the farm must get an MDA bulk storage permit. Farmers must also get an MDA permit if they're storing more than 6,000 gallons of liquid fertilizer.

The storage permit application must include drawings for secondary containment. An application, along with a \$100 fee, must be submitted prior to the start of construction or storage of any dry fertilizer or more than 6,000 gallons of liquid fertilizer. The permit application can be found on the MDA website.

Failing to comply with bulk fertilizer storage requirements may result in further enforcement actions by the MDA. Contamination from a release may also result in a costly environmental cleanup that could be averted when liquid bulk fertilizer tanks or dry fertilizer is in an MDA permitted containment. As a reminder, a release of fertilizer into the environment is an incident that must be immediately reported to the Minnesota Duty Officer at 1-800-422-0798
