Directions:
Day Before! Brine!
To brine: Mix 1 cup salt to one gallon of water in large glass bowl or other nonreactive container. Immerse pheasant in brine and refrigerate overnight, at least 8 hours, no more than 24 hours.

Time to cook!
Preheat oven to 350 degrees

Rinse bird with cold water and pat dry thoroughly with paper towel. Season cavity and outside of bird with salt and pepper. Cut orange, squeeze juice and set aside for sauce. Cut a quarter portion of orange, and stuff in cavity. Stuff cavity with celery, garlic, onion, thyme and sage.

Place bird, breast side up in small roasting pan. Cover breast with bacon slices. Roast bird at 350 degrees until it reaches an internal temperature of 165 degrees and juices run clear. REMEMBER: this is a lean bird! Don't overcook! According to USDA food safety practices, cook at 350 degrees for 30 minutes per pound. Watch and check internal temp to avoid overcooking!!

When bird is cooked thoroughly, remove from oven and place on platter, very loosely covered with foil and allow to rest while you prepare the sauce!

For Sauce:
Reserved orange juice
1/4 cup wine- slightly fruity, slightly dry
2 tablespoons butter
1 cup chicken broth
Skim any extra fat from roasting pan. In the same pan, on medium high heat, add reserved orange juice and wine to deglaze, scraping and stirring all those yummy bits of magic from the bottom of the pan. Once heated and the juice and wine have reduced by half, add the chicken broth. Continue to stir and reduce this mixture until thickens, about 3-5 minutes. Add butter and stir until melted. Remove from heat.

To Serve:
Personal note: I don't care for the "leg" of the pheasant, as it has a number of toothpick type bones. High is fine.

Remove bacon. Halve bird from breast on down, separate from backbone. Place each half on plate and spoon sauce over the meat.

This dish is excellent with a wild rice pilaf and a vegetable such as brussel sprouts, broccoli or salad.

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
