An amendment of the
Stearns County Ordinance
Regulating the Use of County
Parks, Allowing and Prohibit-
ing Certain Conduct Therein
and Providing Penalties For
Violations of the Ordinance.

Ordinance Number 696 was
adopted pursuant to Minneso-
ta Statutes 398.31-398.35 by
the Stearns County Board of
Commissioners at their August
26, 2025 board meeting.

The scope of Ordinance
Number 696 is to repeal prior
Ordinance No. 593 and amend
the language of what was pre-
viously Ordinance No. 593.
Amendments contain docu-
ment format updates that in-
clude a revised ordinance num-
ber, adjusted section numbers
to accommodate new additions,
and general grammatical re-
visions. In Section 2, Definitions,
ATV/UTV has been added un-
der 2.4 within the definition of
"Vehicle." Section 5, Public
Safety, now includes excep-
tions for Chain of Lakes County
Park under items 5.1, 5.3,
and 5.4, along with a new pro-
vision addressing visitor con-
duct to enhance public safety.
Section 6, Environmental Pro-
tection, adds an exception for
Chain of Lakes County Park
under 6.2. A new Section 7 has
been introduced to define the
Chain of Lakes County Park
parcel number and operating
hours, along with subsections
7.1 through 7.17 that outline
park-specific use and hunting
ordinances. Section 9 (formerly
Section 8), Domestic Animals,
includes an exception for
Chain of Lakes County Park
under 9.1. Section 17 (formerly
Section 16), Alcohol and Tobac-
co, has been renamed "ALCO-
HOL, TOBACCO, AND
CANNABIS USE," and now in-
cludes subsection 17.4, which
makes cannabis use unlawful
in Stearns County Parks,
aligning with Ordinance 654.4,
Subd. 1. Section 21 (formerly
Section 20), Ordinance Re-
pealed, reflects an updated or-
dinance number to 696. Final-
ly, Section 22 (formerly Section
21), Effective Date, has been
revised to include the updated
signed year and the current
Chair of the County Board of
Commissioners.

Rockville Remember...



This week's Rockville picture is too old for any of us to recognize, but the building is still here! Built in 1886 on the corner of Cedar St. & Broadway it was still Rockville Township although the Village was platted. (Giving the names of all the streets etc.) The brick building's added wooden structure housed a harness & Barber Shop-removed by the early 1900's when the then owner built a house attached, but recessed from the street, which remains to this day. The original building was a General Store. There were approximately 75 landowners (businesses & farms) in Rockville in those years. Township meetings were held there, travelers could lodge in the upstairs rooms & food, groceries, refreshments were available over these decades (note the fancy Gluek Beer sign attached. This picture was likely taken in 1903 when the Village was incorporated & issued a liquor license for the premise. The entry door was moved to the southeast corner, to accommodate the long bar installed by the time Andrew? Weisman bought the place in 1912. Giving it the UNIQUE "LOOK" to this day! Most remember it as Schneider's Grocery Store/Rockville Post Office... today it houses a Infant Day Care business!

Did You Know That?

Professionals might be returning to work in offices after years of pandemic-related remote work, but that doesn't mean home buyers aren't still prioritizing home office space when shopping for a new place to call their own. According to a recent survey of home buyers conducted by the National Association of Home Builders, 66 percent would prefer to buy a home with exactly one home office space and 13 percent want at least two offices. Just one in five buyers indicated they do not want any home office space. The majority of buyers who want home office space prefer a medium-sized space, which the NAHB defined as between 100 and 150 square feet. Just 22 percent of buyers prefer a home office space larger than 150 square feet, while only 19 percent want a small space (less than 100 square feet). The NAHB survey indicates the enduring popularity of home office spaces, recognition of which can be particularly useful for current homeowners preparing to put their homes on the market as well as those looking to add office space.

Did You Know That?

According to WorldPopulationReview, the average funeral cost as of May 2023 was \$7,630. Funeral costs are affected by a host of variables, including location, so the services may come in below, at or above that median depending on where the ceremony is being held. And while that cost may raise an eyebrow, the National Funeral Directors Association notes that the median cost of a funeral rose 6.6 percent between 2016 and 2021, while the overall rate of inflation was roughly twice that amount (13.98 percent). Individuals who do not want their families to foot the bill for their funerals should know that it's possible to pre-pay for a funeral. States have their own laws regarding pre-paying for a funeral, so in-

dividuals are urged to learn the details of the state where they live prior to handing over any money. Some states protect families that are pre-paying for funerals. For example, the New York State Department of Health notes that individuals who pre-pay for funerals in the Empire State have the right to request a Pre-Need Agreement, which is a document that addresses various details related to the funeral, including how final expenses will be determined; if additional funds will be needed when death occurs; what happens if merchandise selected for the funeral, such as a casket, is no longer available; and what will happen if any money remains after the funeral bill has been paid.
