Violations of the Ordinance. Ordinance Number 696 is adopted pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 398.31-398.35.

The scope of Ordinance Number 696 is to repeal prior Ordinance No. 593 and amend the language of what was previously Ordinance No. 593. Amendments contain document format updates that include a revised ordinance number, adjusted section numbers to accommodate new additions. and general grammatical revisions. In Section 2, Definitions, ATV/UTV has been added under 2.4 within the definition of "Vehicle."
