Tim Weisman's AML Leukemia is in remission now. Many real problems have cropped up to send the family scurrying back to the hospital. He had a severe attack of shingles, a real difficult time for all, then an infection set in. He was barely over that when he needed a dose of gamoglobin because he'd been inadvertently exposed to live polio vaccine (his sister recieved it routinely). This gave Tim a "vacation of sorts". He spent his time at at his Grandmother Weisman's house, until they were sure it was safe at home for him. He also had some kidney problems. All of these were not unexpected... His immune system is low from the treatment so he's very susceptible to germs. He has weekly check-ups and all these problems have been taken care of as well as medical science knows how!

He goes to the Masonic Clinic for his check-ups; this is part of the University of Minnesota Complex. As things continued to get better, he had some of the checks with Doctor Windschitl. His blood was o.k. The white count actually above normal, the red and hemoglobin normal, while the platelettes were a little low, they are considered okay. All this indicates that the leukemia is still in remission! Thanks to all the prayers of family and friends.

Tim's thankful to be alive and home, especially to be able to move about on his own. He likes biking the best and enjoyed some swimming at the local Racquetball Club. He missed baseball this summer the most. His running just wasn't up to par, so he missed his last eligible year of little league! (He was Rockville's star pitcher last year!) Mowing lawn and walking are part of his everyday activities and hes expected to do everything and anything just like any other 13-and-a-half year old boy!

Tim is glad to be at home, but his family is even happier, if possible. His dad and mom say, "It's nice for all of us to be together again." Tim's bothers are all glad he's around. Ronny and Tom think he teases more than ever and if they get too smart he "beats them up", proof of his return to normal! He won't try

that with older brother Bill, of course. Bill always said that Tim would make it okay and not to worry. Michelle is Tim's one and only little sister, and she just smiles and giggles and teases the whole bunch, helping everyone see the love that fills this Rockville home!

Tim enjoyed a special trip; his Gramma Ceil Weisman took him and his mom to California for a week. They stayed with his Aunt Iris and her husband Bob Scofern at Santa Rosa. Tim went to China Town, Marine Land, the petrified forest, the Golden Gate Bridge and he got wet in the Pacific Ocean! He even got to "co-pilot" his uncle's friend's plane! He was enjoying himself so much that he stayed a little longer than planned.

Tim had finished his seventh grade school work early in June with a "home bound" teacher. He started regular 8th grade classes on August 25th. Getting on the bus everyday with his classmates riding the four miles to ROCORI Junior High School in Cold Spring.

During this same time, Tim began some of the tests connected with his three month check-up. The all in portrait bone marrow test consists of freezing an area in the lower back hip, cutting open the flesh and drilling into the bone, taking out a plug so they can extract a sample of the marrow.

He'd been bothered lately by puffiness and blochiness of the skin which indicated to the doctors that there was a possibility of G.V.H. (Graft Versus Host). There were sveral biopsies and many blood tests taken to determine in each person. For Tim, the skin was damaged, some permanently and his liver was affected, but this may be completely reversible!

It took almost two weeks to determine the best procedure; He'll be using the steroid Prednisone for three months plus, but it is doing the job. That is keeping the body from fighting the new life giving blood cells. It does have it's drawbacks; one is a terrific increase in appetite! Tim will have to be very careful about how much he eats, no snacks between meals anymore! There's also the lowering of his immune system again; so he'll have to be very care-

ful as he goes back to school. They are hoping to have a community alert system at the school, so they can warn his family of preventable communicable diseases. Doctor Ralph Quinones and Doctor Nathan Kobrinski are watching over all aspects of Tim's condition and progress as he continues to visit the U of M Hospital weekly.

Tim spent his 14th birthday, September 3, 1980, in the hospital; those same nurses, long time friends, surprised him with a birthday cake which all enjoyed! Tim has improved much during this past month and is cheerful and confident that all is going well again for him. His is truly a success story!

Tim's Progress through the 8th grade and into the summer of 1981 was slow but evident to all. His grades were super, as usual, his check-ups were increasingly positive. As he continued to feel better and look better, he also regained his appetite and much of his resistance to other germ invasions. There were some minor set-backs and of course, the normal adolescent problems. The check-ups were spread out to every three months because of his positive progress.

Tim enjoyed school (as much as any teenager), swimming at the local Swim and Racquetball Club, biking with his brothers and friends and teasing his little sister. TV is a favorite past-time too; he prefers music in the pop-rock genre, the group Journey is one of his favorites. He especially enjoyed a trip to his Guggenberger cousins home in Louisville, Kentucky during the summer months; another airplane flight, but this time he was not in charge! Pastor Father Paul Zylla visited Tim and took him and a few others to some professional sports events in the cities. A few other friends hosted Tim at various games which he thoroughly enjoyed! He earned some spending money collecting, smashing and turning in aluminum cans and painting his grandmothers' garages... whether they needed it or not! (What would we do without Grammas?)

September 3rd, 1981, Tim turned 15, a few friends joined the family for cake and ice cream after Tim spent the entire birthday routine at school! Later that week he went to the

University Hospital for his routine check-up; many of the same nurses are still there. Lo and behold, they also have a birthday cake in celebration!

Tim's grades are super at ROCORI When he was a regular 9th grader riding the bus everyday. He'd joined the band with plans to travel with them in the summer. (He really likes traveling!) Hockey was becoming a very popular sport during December; the Rockville fellows would clear the ice at Grand Lake and play a rough and tumble game of hockey whenever they could. Tim was right in there with the gang! Smash, crash, bang, and ouch! He had also resumed serving Mass; the whole parish rejoiced to see him at Christmas, back in procession with the other servers.

On January 8, 1982, Tim went to the University Hospital for his regular check-up. It was four days later, the 12th, that the Weisman's recieved the unexpected results. There was a blast in Tim's blood; the dreaded AML Lukemia had reappeared. Tim was experiencing a relapse! It was hard to believe, everything had seemed to be progressing well.

Back to the University Hospital, many tests, and much consultation, fears and tears filled the next days. The family's prayers were answered for after-some preliminary treatments Tim was set up on an out-patient basis. The doctors then came up with some choices, Shirley and Mike allowed Tim to make his decision for treatment, including chemotherapy. He'll be starting his series of treatments by the middle of March; many of the same nurses still working with him, renewing old friendships.
