Stearns County Hazardous Waste Collection in Richmond August 26th!

The Stearns County Household Hazardous Waste truck will be in town on Wednesday, August 26th from 10:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. at the Richmond Civic Arena. This is the time to roundup those items that cannot be thrown out with your "regular" garbage, such as those energy efficient "pig tail" light bulbs!

Items that will be collected include: This is a chance for residents to get rid of all those unsafe or nuisance products lying around the house – such as paints, cleaners, poisons, roofing tar, fuels, automotive chemicals with the exception of motor oil, sealers, garden chemicals, pool chemicals, fluorescent bulbs, adhesives, aerosols, solvents, mothballs and mercury.

The mobile collection unit cannot take products such as: Used motor oil (a used oil recycling facility is permanently located in Cold Spring at 304 2nd Ave. N.E., by the Public Works Garage), antifreeze, explosives, furniture, household garbage, tires, medical waste, appliances or any other unknown products. **Business waste is also not accepted.** These collections are designed to collect home, not business products.

The Hazardous Waste service is free of charge!
