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An Apple a Day!

What signals fall more than apples! Because there are so many delicious apple varieties to choose from, and seasonality depends on weather, be sure to call your orchard to determine what is ripe and ready for picking. A trip to an apple orchard is a fun activity for families and it's important to choose an orchard that meets your needs.

Minnesota apple growers are well known for growing flavorful apples like Zestar, SweetTango, Honeycrisp, and Haralson but many orchards also provide family-friendly experiences like hayrides, corn mazes, pumpkin patches, fall raspberry picking and photo opportunities. Some orchards even have their own on-farm bakeries or restaurants. Visiting orchards in the fall is a wonderful family activity that can combine nature, nurture and education!

To plan a day trip, consider The Minnesota Department of Agriculture's Minnesota Grown Directory is a free statewide guide to more than 100 apple orchards. The directory also includes a comprehensive list of fall raspberry patches, corn mazes, wineries and more. You can search the directory online at www.minnesotagrown.com. Take Steps to Ensure a Healthy Harvest

With the long days of summer behind us, many individuals think of harvesting those last tomatoes and peppers before the first frost. While it can be tempting to try and harvest all fruits and vegetables that remain on the vine, it is important to take special care in choosing late season produce, especially for home canning.

Fruits and vegetables that become overripe and soft should not be used for

canning, freezing or drying. Overly ripe fruits are often lower in acid (higher in pH) and canning this type of fruit may be unsafe. In addition, overly ripe fruits and vegetables will not be of high enough quality for freezing or drying. Decayed or damaged produce can also present a problem and should not be canned because these foods may also be lower in acid. While it may be safe to remove decayed or damaged areas from some foods for freezing or drying, carefully wash and inspect all foods to ensure that damaged areas are completely removed.

Tomatoes are one fruit where there is special concern regarding the quality of the fruit that is harvested. As tomatoes become overly ripe, they can become dramatically lower in acid and higher in pH. Damaged areas on tomatoes caused by bruises, cracks, blossom end rot or insects can also lower acid content. Tomatoes exposed to frost or tomatoes harvested from dead vines may also be lower in acid. Do not attempt to can or process tomatoes that are overly ripe or damaged, and do not harvest tomatoes from dead or frost-killed vines. And do not ripen green tomatoes indoors for canning, the proper acidity may not develop. Instead, harvest green tomatoes from late season or frost-damaged vines and use these green tomatoes in a relish or salsa.

Expanded Recall of Wire Brushes for Grills!

This recall expansion involves Cuisinart metal wire bristle grill brushes. The brushes have black plastic, stainless steel, and wood handles. Small metal wire bristles can detach from the brushes and stick to the grill or food, posing an ingestion hazard and risk of serious internal injuries that could require surgery.

The following model numbers were previously recalled and can be found on the product packaging: CCB-100, CCB-4125, CCB-5014, CCB-6450, CCB-8012, CCB-4114, CCB-W2, and CSBS-777. The following model numbers are part of this recall expansion: CGWM-024, CGWM-059, FCB-501, CGS-W18, CCB-134, CGWM-061, CB-395, CCB-3001, CGWM-077, CGWM-058, CCB-012/021, CGWM-060, and FBH-51.

In addition to the identified models, additional Cuisinart brand wire bristle brushes were sold individually and in sets, prior to 2020. All Cuisinart wire bristle grill brushes are included in the recall.

The word "Cuisinart" is stamped on the brush handle of the identified models except FCB-501 and CCB-395, where the handle is not stamped. Some of the recalled brushes were also sold as part of the Premium Grill 10 Piece set (CGS-2010), 13 Piece Wooden Handle Grill Tool Set (CGS-W13), 14 Piece Deluxe Stainless Steel Grill Set (CGS-5014), and 20 Piece Deluxe Grill Set, (CGS-5).

Consumers should stop using the recalled grill brushes immediately and contact Conair for a full refund or a credit for use at Cuisinart.com for a full refund plus 20% of the cash refund amount. Consumers will be asked to discard the recalled grill brushes.

Conair is aware of at least 54 reports and reviews where small wire bristles detached from the grill brushes, including three reports of consumers who swallowed metal bristles and sought medical treatment to remove the bristles from their digestive tract or throat.

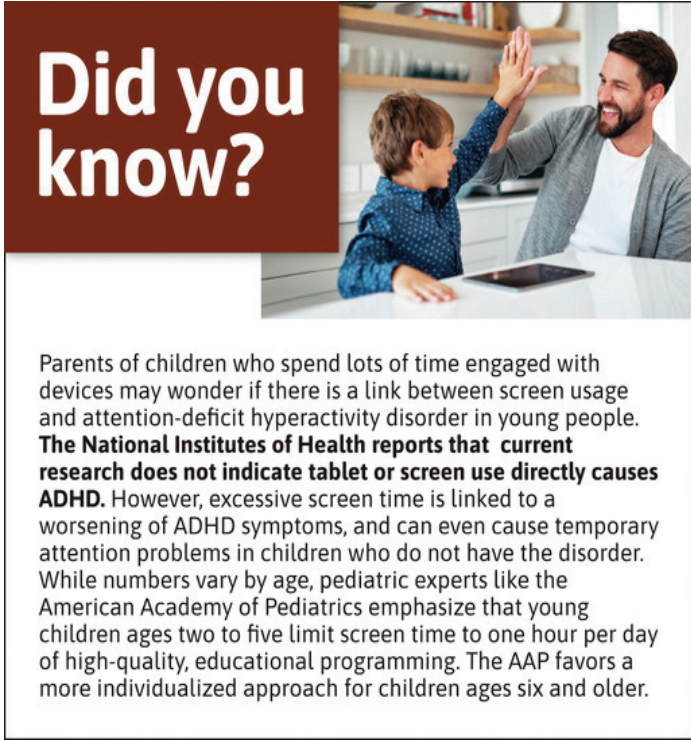

Did you know?

Parents of children who spend lots of time engaged with devices may wonder if there is a link between screen usage and attention-deficit hyperactivity disorder in young people. The National Institutes of Health reports that current research does not indicate tablet or screen use directly causes ADHD. However, excessive screen time is linked to a worsening of ADHD symptoms, and can even cause temporary attention problems in children who do not have the disorder. While numbers vary by age, pediatric experts like the American Academy of Pediatrics emphasize that young children ages two to five limit screen time to one hour per day of high-quality, educational programming. The AAP favors a more individualized approach for children ages six and older.
